The Board currently levies property taxes to pay debt service on other outstanding general obligation bonds that have been issued to finance voter approved projects. The incremental property taxes would decrease upon the repayment of the currently outstanding bonds, but the decrease will not occur if the proposed bonds are issued. Taking into account the repayment of the outstanding bonds, the Board expects that the issuance of the proposed bonds, in the manner currently expected, will result in an estimated tax increase in the amount of approximately \$238.27 per year on a primary residence with the District average value of \$450,000 and of approximately \$433.23 per year on a business or secondary residence having the same value, which is equal to \$19.86 per month on the primary residence and \$36.10 per month on a business or secondary residence. The foregoing is only an estimate and is not a limit on the amount of taxes that the governing body may be required to levy in order to pay debt service on the bonds.
